


# Keep Your Family Safe From Ticks.

Plan an effective tick reduction strategy:


## Apply an Effective Pesticide

- Use an EPA-registered product, labeled for tick control
  - Follow all pesticide label instructions and warning
  - Apply pesticide ONCE in the spring
  - If needed, apply pesticide a SECOND time in the fall
  - Treat ONLY the risky tick zones, NOT open, sunny lawns
  - Consider hiring a tick management professional

## Manage Your Landscape

- Clear dead leaves
  - Keep lawn trimmed short
  - Create a barrier (e.g., woodchips) between lawn and forest or brushy edge
  - If needed, apply pesticide a SECOND time in the fall
  - Remove barberry bushes
- 

## Discourage Deer Visits

- Select deer-resistant plantings
  - Install deer fencing
  - Avoid feeding deer
-
